MINUTES APPROVAL:

At this time, Chairman Schmidt presented plaques to Gregory T. Daly and Peter Squirlock, Jr., commemorating their individual accomplishment of "25 Years of Service" with the Authority. It was noted by Mr. Bongiovanni and Mr. Solla that these two employees came up through the ranks and continue to provide outstanding service to the Authority.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:

FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of August (copy attached), along with the vouchers which he recommended payment be made, and the monthly financial reports for Hatch Mott MacDonald and Johnson and Conway. Also noted was the 6 month Interim Financial Report for the Boards review.

PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:

Mr. Phelan presented the Personnel Actions for the month of August. On motion by Mr. Phelan, seconded by Mr. Verdonik, the Personnel Actions were approved by the following vote (copy attached):

PLANT OPERATIONS:

Mr. Kerwin noted the Operating report on the table. He also noted that for the first time this year, foreign sludge has surpassed our septage intake.

PLANNING AND EXPANSION:

Mr. Notte was absent.

CONSTRUCTION:

Mr. Verdonik noted the Construction report on the table. At this time John Napolitano explained to the Board that he has spoken to Iron Hills and Chavond Barry regarding the Incinerator #1 Project and will now be preparing a settlement agreement which will be ready for signature next month.

INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:

Mr. Wild had nothing to report. He discussed legislation S-2844/S-4232 noting that Lincoln park is passing a resolution to oppose the two bills.

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Mr. Campisi had nothing to report.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Bongiovanni did not have a formal report. He did review the 2013 Summary of TBSA Extension Approvals and Connections that was on the table.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. **HMM**

On the table is an HMM memo stating the floor loading in the skimming's building is acceptable for the peracetic acid equipment. HMM wants to look at the lay-out once it has been completed.

2. Ash Reuse

As of Monday, Spectraserv started cleaning out Ash Lagoon #2 and will follow with cleaning out Ash Lagoon #1. Our 3 year agreement of \$92/ton, which is an excellent rate ends in September.

3. Energy Curtailment

From the correspondence, you can see that the Authority received our 2nd check for 2012 and the total to date. I am amazed that we didn't have to curtail during the week that the temperatures ranged between 95 -100 degrees. As of now, all that is left to do is a one hour test in September to drop load to be paid for 2013.

4. Sludge Disposal Meetings

On July 18th Ernie and I met with PVSC. On July 23rd we met with Spectraserv and on August 7th we met with Synagro.

We have received hard numbers from PVSC. Spectraserv sent us rough numbers and as of this afternoon we received rough numbers from Synagro. We also met with PVSC again today.

We were given the same pricing as Wayne. Wayne sent me their numbers with trucking. Par-Troy was interested in signing a contract but we found out today that their disposal cost is 7cents/gallon.

We will be working with Black and Veatch to see hard numbers on what the cost will be to shut down the incinerators versus hauling away. Preliminary time line to shutdown will be: earliest June 30, 2014 to January 1, 2015.

5. CP Engineers Bioremediation Project

On August 5th, Ernie, Donna and I met with Sean Sauder of CP Engineers. The conclusion drawn from the meeting was not to bioremediate at this time. The defined area is larger and will be more costly than anticipated with no guarantees.

Speaking with Ernie, the recommendation is to hold off until we do the plant upgrade. In reference to the DEP letter dated June 17th, we are going to send the state the most recent investigation that CP Engineers, LSRP Joe Norton completed under this project instead of the investigation from 1994.

The DEP is looking to close out all the sites in New Jersey that have been ongoing since the early 90's. Our plan is to send in the most recent investigation with the goal to complete the remediation with the plant upgrade.

6. Generator and Flood Improvement Monies

As you can see from the correspondence, there has been a flurry of activity with both projects. We have been responding to both with the help of HMM and continue to watch them closely.

7. Electric Energy Group

There is a meeting tomorrow that John Napolitano and I will be attending. The purpose of the meeting is to decide if we want to stay with our current agent or look at reverse auctions. The current contract expires May of 2014.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mr. Pete Ripkey of HMM distributed copies of the monthly Engineers Report and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects.

Mr. Solla explained to the Board that the Authority had originally approved the Bar Screen Study at a not to exceed amount of \$12,000 and now additional services are necessary which would increase the cost by \$7,500 with a new not-to-exceed \$19,500. He noted discussing this increase with the Executive Director and Chairman Schmidt where approval to proceed as requested was made.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS: Preliminary FY 2014 Budget Review

It was noted that no surplus was being applied. However there is a savings in interest expense due to bond redemption which will be temporally financed by the use of surplus. Other reductions in expenses were noted.

RESOLUTION OF THE PEQUANNOCK, LINCOLN PARK AND FAIRFIELD SEWERAGE AUTHORITY ELECTING TO CALL FOR REDEMPTION CERTAIN OUTSTANDING REVENUE BONDS OF THE AUTHORITY AND AUTHORIZING VARIOUS ACTIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, The Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority (the "Authority") issued on April 24, 2003 its Refunding Revenue Bonds (Series 2003) (the "2003 Bonds") pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Authority on November 5, 1975 and entitled: "Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of Revenue Bonds of The Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority", as amended and supplemented (the "General Bond Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, the 2003 Bonds are currently outstanding in the aggregate principal amount of \$4,780,000 and mature on December 1, 2013 in the principal amount of \$1,515,000, December 1, 2014 in the principal amount of \$1,590,000 and December 1, 2015 in the principal amount of \$1,675,000; and

WHEREAS, the 2003 Bonds that mature on December 1, 2014 and December 1, 2015 (the "Callable 2003 Bonds") are subject to redemption at the option of the Authority on December 1, 2013 (the "Redemption Date"), upon the terms and conditions set forth in the General Bond Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Callable 2003 Bonds maturing on December 1, 2014 bear interest at the rate of 5.125% per annum and the Callable 2003 Bonds maturing on December 1, 2015 bear interest at the rate of 4% per annum; and

WHEREAS, if the Callable 2003 Bonds are redeemed on the Redemption Date, the Authority will not have to pay the interest that would otherwise be payable on the Callable 2003 Bonds from the Redemption Date to the respective maturity dates thereof which interest amounts to \$215,487.50; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has funds available to pay the redemption price of the Callable 2003 Bonds (i.e., the principal amount thereof or \$3,265,000) on the Redemption Date; and

WHEREAS, the Authority is desirous of exercising its option to redeem the Callable 2003 Bonds on the Redemption Date and authorizing various actions in connection therewith;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority, and the members or commissioners thereof, as follows:

Section 1. Redemption of Callable 2003 Bonds. The Authority hereby elects to redeem the Callable 2003 Bonds on December 1, 2013 (or as soon thereafter as possible).

Section 2. Actions to be Taken. The Executive Director and Assistant Executive Director of the Authority (each, an "Authorized Official") are each hereby authorized and directed, after consultation with bond counsel to the Authority, to do all matters and to take such actions as may be useful, necessary, convenient or desirable in connection with the redemption of the Callable 2003 Bonds including, without limitation, (a) sending a certified copy of this resolution to The Bank of New York Mellon, the trustee under the General Bond Resolution for the Callable 2003 Bonds (the "Trustee"), (b) preparing and sending, or instructing the Trustee to prepare and send, such other notices of redemption of the Callable 2003 Bonds as may be required by the General Bond Resolution or as may be otherwise desirable, including a notice to bondholders and to the Electronic Municipal Market Access website maintained by the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board in substantially the form set forth in Exhibit A hereto, with such modifications, additions and deletions as may be approved by an Authorized Official, (c) transferring, or instructing the Trustee to transfer, monies to and from such funds and accounts of the Authority as may be necessary or desirable to accomplish the redemption of the Callable 2003 Bonds, (d) requesting the auditor of the Authority to prepare and deliver a report, letter or other similar document verifying the amount of monies necessary, without reinvestment, to accomplish the redemption of the Callable 2003 Bonds on the Redemption Date, (e) requesting bond counsel to the Authority to prepare and deliver an opinion as to the defeasance of the Callable 2003 Bonds and (f) taking such action as may be necessary or desirable in connection with the defeasance of the lien of and the covenants set forth in the General Bond Resolution.

Section 3. <u>Capitalized Terms</u>. Unless a different meaning is clear from the context, all capitalized words and terms used but not defined in this resolution shall have the meanings ascribed to such words and terms, respectively, in the preambles to this resolution.

Section 4. <u>Effective Date</u>. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
