#### 2. Banking Services

We have attempted to use Valley National Bank for all of our accounts, but they have flatly refused to make any changes to their terms and conditions, which we have numerous objections to. Fortunately, TD Bank who currently handles our local banking needs (checking, deposits etc.), is somewhat more receptive. Given the end of this month as our deadline to move our former trustee accounts out of Bank of New York Mellon, we are setting up new accounts for this purpose with TD

Bank. Their terms and conditions are less onerous and we will be seeking some changes and explanations.

## 3. NACWA Petition on EPA Incineration Rules

NACWA is proceeding with their plan to seek a stay on the March 2016 rule compliance deadline. They are in the process of supplying additional costs and consequences information to bolster their position.

#### 4. EPA Title V Requirements

While Diane Alexander continues to believe that we have a decent chance of success in challenging a possible requirement for preparing and submitting a Title V application by March 21, 2014 deadline, the costs of the legal challenge may be prohibitive. On Monday, we received a proposal from Black and Veatch to prepare and submit a Minor Source Permit Application, which covers Title V only for the incinerator, at an estimated cost of \$16,298 (basic cost) to \$27,802 (with additional services). On Tuesday, Mike sent an email to EPA Region 2 addressing our issue with a copy of our January 6<sup>th</sup> letter to DEP, and requesting their response to our question, simply stated: if we are shutting down our incinerator operations prior to the March 2016 compliance deadline, is there any need for submission of a Title V application by March 2014? *A discussion followed*.
