FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman noted the Treasurer's Report for the month of January (copy attached), along with the vouchers and the monthly financial reports for Hatch Mott MacDonald and Johnson and Conway.

PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:

Mr. Phelan presented the Personnel Actions for the month of January. On motion by Mr. Phelan, seconded by Mr. Wild the Personnel Actions were approved by the following vote:

PLANT OPERATIONS:

Mr. Kerwin noted the Operating report on the table.

Mr. Solla added that this was the second month in a row that the Authority processed approximately 2.35 million gallons of outside sludge due to Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission (PVSC) being closed from Hurricane Sandy. He stated that the Authority took extra deliveries from October 31st through December 21, 2012. PVSC opened and then shut down again due to a broken pipe. The Authority took extra deliveries again; December 27, 2012 through January 2, 2013. This should be the end of extra deliveries.

Also, Mr. Solla reported that there were three odor complaints on December 14, 2012 and one on December 18, 2012. These complaints were due to the closure of PVSC and the Authority processing so much extra sludge. TBSA is back to normal operations at this time, and the complaints should cease. The NJDEP was made aware of this situation by Superintendent, Ernie DeGraw because of the extra volume of sludge the Authority was handling to help many other treatment plants.

PLANNING and EXPANSION:

Mr. Notte was absent. Mr. Solla reported that he spoke with Diane Alexander; she stated that the records from the Office of Administration Law Hearings were still being sent to the Appellate Court. She also stated that the Authority probably will not see the Final Discharge Permit until the Appellate Court rules on the Phosphorus issue.

CONSTRUCTION:

Mr. Verdonik was absent. Ernie DeGraw reported on Incinerator #1 repairs; he stated that Trace is almost complete and that TBSA's consultant has to do their review. Once the review is completed then the next subject will be dealing with Iron Hills.

Mr. Solla reported that National Water Main is on the Agenda for final payment, which will complete the Sewer Rehabilitation and Inspection Project.

INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:

Mr. Wild had nothing to report.

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

The Board has a discussion regarding FEMA. It was noted that FEMA has not redone maps in 30 years and it intends to change the elevation of Flood Plains, which could cause people that are not required to have flood insurance at this time, to have it. Also, this will affect the Authority's insurance.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Bongiovanni was absent.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. CP Engineers – Bioremediation Project

The borings were completed and test results will be in by the end of January. Once the results are received, the area to be remediated will be defined.

2. Sturbridge Massachusetts Plant Site Visit

Mr. DeGraw's report is on the table.

3. Energy Curtailment

Patrick Tuohey's report is on the table. The Authority received a check for the first half of 2012. The total amount received to date is \$214,084.16.

4. <u>FEMA – Hurricane Sandy</u>

To date, Bill Murphy has submitted approximately \$125,000 in claims. This number could possibly go up.

5. Incineration Review

Mr. DeGraw reviewed the incineration cost per dry ton; report on the table. He went over the figures with Rockaway Valley Regional Sewerage Authority (RVRSA) sludge and without RVRSA; with only one belt filter press running; also noting all the extra plants we helped during Hurricane Sandy. He felt that the price charged per ton during Hurricane Sandy was fair with the dollars it cost the Authority to burn the extra sludge. Mr. Voorman questioned the extra ash production.

Mr. DeGraw stated that EPA Special Agent, Jason Burgess called to thank the Authority for all its help with the Fleetwash Case; noting that the case is now closed.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:
