REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:

FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of June (copy attached), along with the vouchers and the monthly financial reports for Hatch Mott MacDonald and Cleary Giacobbe Alfieri Jacobs. He recommended the payment of bills as presented.

PURCHASING & PERSONNEL:

Mr. Phelan presented the Personnel Actions for June. At this time Mr. Solla discussed the recommendations suggested for the dedicated employees that extended so much time and

effort to the Authority during the five emergency snow episodes. He explained that he sent a memo to Mr. Phelan, who in turn, read it to the Board. Mr. Phelan expressed his admiration toward the staff and explained that the recommendation for the men is to award them extra time off with pay. Mr. Notte asked the staff to recommend an award for Ernie DeGraw, as his dedication to TBSA is 24/7, particularly during the storms. Possible compensation was suggested, it was noted by the Director, Robert Bongiovanni that Ernie is hard pushed to use his vacation time at the end of each year.

On motion by Mr. Phelan, seconded by Mr. Verdonik the Personnel Actions were approved by the following vote:

PLANT OPERATIONS:

Mr. Schmidt noted the Operating Report on the table and commented on the impact of the wet spring on plant flows. Mr. Solla informed the Board that there was a meeting regarding headworks with Mr. Schmidt and a discussion took place to review all the changes to the Authority operations since the incineration shutdown. As indicated on Page 1 of the Operations Report, the PAC has been shut down at a cost savings and we are still well below our limit of 5.0 and 5.4. Mr. Bongiovanni noted that the phosphorous load has been cut in half and stated the importance of reaching equilibrium at some point, particularly as our limits will be lowered. Mr. Solla mentioned that our fuel oil costs were zero last month and electric was down \$7,000. Results so far have been encouraging as costs have been lower than anticipated. Next month will be the test as we will no longer be accepting foreign sludge. Mr. Solla also referred to the Lab Manager's Report and discussed the fecal count tests performed during the flood which proved a good test of the UV system.

PLANNING & EXPANSION:

Mr. Kerwin referred to Mr. Solla. Mr. Solla informed the Board that the TWA Application at 60% design for plan specifications for the headworks project was sent to the State. We received notice from State that it is administratively complete and is now in technical review. Mr. Solla complimented Mr. Scheri on his work with the trust. Mr. Solla also discussed the issue regarding the Office of the State Comptroller and notification of the November B&V contract award. In response to our notification, the OSC requested a great deal of information. He noted that the Authority was able to provide that information to the OSC earlier than requested and it is now in review.

A meeting was held to discuss Mr. Schmidt's questions concerning the main plant generator and the need for two generators. Mr. Scheri reviewed and presented options based on new rules and plant requirements. Notes of meeting will be sent to the Board.

CONSTRUCTION:

Mr. Verdonik had nothing to report.

INSURANCE AND LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:

Mr. Wild had nothing to report. Mr. Napolitano mentioned Infrastructure Trust Funding bills have been introduced and bills limiting fracking. Mr. Schmidt inquired about the correspondence relating to public officials liability insurance.

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Mr. Campisi was absent.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. Phosphorus TMDL Appeal

After an initial filing in 2009, our appeal for seasonal phosphorus limits was denied by unanimous decision of the Appellate Division on May 15, 2014. The primary basis of this decision is the deference given to the DEP Commissioner and his position that the seasonal limits are "institutionally impracticable". Further discussion of this recent legal decision is scheduled later for closed session.

2. Tiered Drinking Water Uses

The last time that I reported on this matter was in February 2013. At that time we (with AEA) concluded a series of meetings with the DEP to develop a formal rulemaking to address a reasonable approach to handling the application of drinking water standards to all fresh waters of the state, with particular focus on nitrates and total dissolved solids (TDS). Last week on June 3rd, the DEP sent an email "Stakeholder Invitation" to discuss "a potential draft proposal to establish a new method of implementing the nitrate criterion based on Tiered Drinking Water Uses". I am planning to attend that DEP meeting which is scheduled for next Tuesday, June 17th at 9:00 a.m.

In a seemingly related matter, Paul Schorr (DEP – Water Supply) has scheduled a visit of several facilities on the Passaic River (including TBSA) to update the status of nitrate management. This visit is scheduled for next Thursday, June 19th.

At this time, Mr. DeGraw mentioned that the Authority was contacted by a scientist from the USEPA who was beginning a study on micro constituents and their effects on intakes of drinking water. The EPA mistakenly thought TBSA discharged into the Passaic River. Mr. Notte noted that the EPA may be trying to build a data base for monitoring purposes.

3. Union Contract

Our first contract negotiation meeting is scheduled for next Wednesday, June 18th at 10:00 a.m. At that time we expect to receive the UPSEU proposal.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Solla stated that the TWA is at 60%. There is a meeting planned with Black & Veatch, HMM and staff on June 24th. TBSA is hoping to have final design by August 1st. Goal is to have advertisement in September.

1. Radio System Upgrade:

A representative from the previous company contacted TBSA and would like to present a proposal. They arranged for the old equipment to be removed free of charge. Mr. DeGraw explained that Verizon no longer wants to support the lease lines. The Authority is trying to combine radio and alarm systems but with the narrow banding of the radio frequency we will lose range. This is the first company to propose a digital system that will expand our range and bring alarm systems back to pump stations. The equipment may be purchased through a County or State contract. Mr. Wild inquired whether this has been used anywhere else.

2. Village Area Sewers:

The Pequannock dewatering project was having some safety issues with the connection into the TBSA line, but they have since been rectified.

3. Pompton River Bridge Project:

Mr. Solla referred to the handouts on the table and discussed the meeting he attended on June 9th which was organized by Frelinghuysen's office and requested by Lincoln Park. The plan discussed is to extend the bridge but keep the same elevation as the old one with no consideration given to the flooding problems. The DOT was not in attendance. All information

is being sent to Army Corps of Engineers as they were not aware of the project and another meeting is scheduled in two weeks. Project is scheduled to begin in March.

4. UV Bulbs:

Pat Tuohey & Ernie DeGraw did a lot of research on UV bulbs and were able to get a great price. The Authority will not have to purchase bulbs, possibly for another four years.

5. All Pro Car Wash IPP and Other Subjects:

All Pro had requested a waiver from the discharge permit requirements. HMM reviewed and responded to All Pro's comments and the Authority determined that a waiver would not be granted at this time. Discussions ensued regarding continuing participation in NACWA; ESC work related to the incineration shut down; the delivery of the Southside impellors; and the WEA conference. Mr. Solla also discussed his visit to the Fair Lawn pump station with Mr. DeGraw to see their collection system.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mr. John Scheri, of HMM distributed copies of the monthly Engineers Report and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects. *A discussion followed*.

Mr. DeGraw left the meeting at 7 p.m.
