FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of November along with the monthly financial reports for Hatch Mott MacDonald and Johnson and Conway and the voucher lists with a recommendation to approve the vouchers as presented.

Four proposals were received for each project. The proposals were reviewed expensively by the committee and the Authority staff. Interviews were held Monday and Tuesday of this week. Further discussion was held during closed session.

CONSTRUCTION:

Mr. Verdonik presented the construction report. The last project has been completed; the repairs on Incinerator #1, with an agreement reached with Iron Hills Construction. A resolution on tonight's agenda approves the settlement and final payment will be on next month's agenda.

INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:

Mr. Wild had nothing to report.

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Mr. Campisi had nothing to report.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. Discharge Permit and Related Items

Regarding the TMDL Appeal, on October 25, 2013 Diane Alexander has filed a Reply Brief on our behalf, in response to the NJDWSC and NJDEP briefs.

2. Early Redemption of 2003 Bonds

The bond redemption notices were published as scheduled on October 31, 2013. The final payment on the Series 2003 Bonds is \$4,893,065.63. It includes the normal principal and interest payment due on December 1, 2013 and the principal amounts due in 2014 and 2015. Our auditors have just recently prepared a verification report as to the accuracy of the final payment amount required for bond redemption.

3. NACWA Petition on EPA Incineration Rules

NACWA is proposing a new action plan for the Sewage Sludge Incineration Advocacy Coalition. They will seek a stay on the March 2016 rule compliance deadline and continue to challenge EPA's rules. At Art Schmidt's suggestion, we will consider continued participation in this action including monitory support.

Absent any changes in EPA's position, we will be preparing notifications to the regulatory agencies and our sludge customers of our intent to discontinue sludge incineration.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. Hazard Mitigation Grant Program

Bob Bongiovanni, John Scheri and I were requested to attend a meeting at the Governor's Office in Trenton. The state received over 750 "Letters of Intent" requesting aid for generators and other energy solutions. The state has allocated \$159,840 through the grant program for the Authority.

John Scheri and I attended a mandatory meeting at NJEIT regarding the grant. They reviewed many issues that were previously discussed in Trenton. A very interesting topic discussed was generators and air permitting. Going forward the Authority must determine whether the costs for the generators are warranted in order to be able to curtail during emergencies.

A Memorandum of Understanding was received which must be completed in detail in order to receive the grant allocation. Another form called the Spend Plan must be sent to the state by December 15th, which describes as best possible, how the grant will be used.

2. Radio System

The Authority has severed ties with Royal Communications, Inc. as they are no longer State Contract. As Royal was the vendor and is no longer an authorized Motorola dealer, we have requested that Motorola remove their equipment from the Authority as it may not be the correct equipment for the project.

3. WEFTEC 2013 CHICAGO CONFERENCE

Ernie DeGraw's memo on the conference, which was in the correspondence file, was very complete. The conference displayed many vendors which allowed us to view and discuss parts and equipment necessary for the plant's anticipated headworks project.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mr. John Scheri, of HMM distributed copies of the monthly Engineers Report and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

None

NEW BUSINESS: 10 Year Summary of Costs and Revenues

Mr. Bongiovanni presented his memo of November 13th and reviewed his summary explaining that he drops the first year and adds the new year which allows for a ten year history of revenues and expenses. He noted that last year our energy costs had gone down partially due to the stabilization of oil pricing and the fact that the Authority is not burning as much sludge as it had been.

He noted that the yields on investments have fluctuated but over the last few years it has been just about zero. The Participant payments have increased 58.74% over the ten years with an average of 4.84% per year.

Mr. Bongiovanni explained that at this time the Authority has a good amount of Retained Earnings which is a plus, as we are in a period of transition, with the redemption of the callable bonds and the consideration of proceeding with multiple major capital projects. Mr. Bongiovanni suggested that should the Board have any question or comments to feel free to reach out to him.
