The Regular Meeting of the Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority was held on Wednesday, September 10, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. in the evening, in its Administration Building, Lincoln Boulevard, Lincoln Park, New Jersey. Vice Chairman Voorman called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:

FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of September (copy attached), along with the vouchers and the monthly financial reports for Hatch Mott MacDonald and Cleary Giacobbe Alfieri Jacobs. He recommended the payment of bills as presented. Mr. Voorman also noted the Auditor's 6-month financial statements on the table.

PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:

Mr. Phelan noted no Personnel Actions for the month of September.

PLANT OPERATIONS:

Mr. Schmidt noted the Operating report on the table. He noted that the flows were low due to the lack of rain. Mr. Solla noted that the Authority accepted 5,000 gallons of sludge from Oakland as a courtesy.

PLANNING AND EXPANSION:

Mr. Kerwin deferred to Mr. Solla. Mr. Solla noted that he had invited Mr. Rectanus to the Authority a month earlier than originally planned in order to resolve the issues regarding ESC prior to going out to bid. He noted that we are on a tight time schedule and we need to be on the NJEIT funding cycle. He spoke to the Office of the State Comptroller (OSC) and they want to see final specifications 30 days before we advertise. The Authority is hoping to have the specifications sent by October 8th. Mr. Solla also noted that regulatory requirements are getting crazy and that the Authority now has to report to both the OSC and the Local Finance Board. He also discussed the meeting scheduled with the Authority's bond counsel, Bob Beinfield, on September 25th for the purpose of discussing the funding schedule. The Authority anticipated awarding the construction contract in December, but it will most likely not happen until January. Also discussed was the possible bidding of the pump station contract first, as it is under 10 million and does not require OSC approval. For funding however, TBSA prefers one loan as it will save the Authority in excess of \$300,000. Mr. Bongiovanni noted that for purposes of funding, both projects need to have the same status with regard to principal forgiveness in order for them to be considered one loan. Mr. Solla commended Mr. Scheri on his ability to keep everything on schedule. He noted the Treatment Works Approvals and environmental summary on the table.

Mr. Rectanus discussed the status of the headworks project. There was a productive meeting with TBSA staff to review the 90% progress documents. He expects to have the completed documents by September 30th for staff final approval. He explained to the Board that the Authority was informed this morning that OSC requires that there be no changes to documents after being submitted, which could delay the project a month. Mr. Rectanus also discussed how B&V, along with the Authority, are working to resolve how to incorporate the Authority's instrumentation and control system consultant (ESC) most effectively in terms of supporting the project. It was decided that it would be most effective if ESC was working with the Authority and the engineering team during construction rather than working directly for the contractor. He noted additional meetings are planned to determine how the control system integration will be accomplished.

Mr. Rectanus mentioned that the updated cost projection for the project has been submitted. Additional work has been added but the contingency allowance has been reduced. The total costs are \$300,000 higher than previously suggested. Any changes after the submission to OSC will have to be made by addendum to bid documents. Mr. Solla noted that December 18th is the anticipated date for bid opening. Mr. Schmidt inquired and Mr. Solla confirmed that we are designing to the 500-year plus six inches flood level.

Mr. Scheri discussed the status of Project 2, noting that the documents are being finalized and that this project only requires authorization from the DEP. He mentioned that the Authority is striving toward advertising on or about October 15th for Project 2, with an anticipated bid receipt prior to the December meeting. He noted that the construction cost estimate has been updated with some additions and deletions. Mr. Scheri referred to the original estimate of 3.4 million which has been increased to 3.5 million, and the loan application was submitted at 4 million. Permits were received, comments have been submitted to Trenton on flood hazard and wetlands permits and we have requested expediting the review.

Mr. Rectanus left the meeting at 7:23 p.m.

CONSTRUCTION:

Mr. Verdonik had nothing to report.

INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:

Mr. Wild had nothing to report. Mr. Napolitano discussed the Client Notice regarding new rules for employment applications and interviews.

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Mr. Campisi was absent. Mr. Napolitano mentioned the potential change of venue for the AEA conference due to the anticipated bankruptcy of the Taj Mahal Hotel.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Bongiovanni had no formal report.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. LSRP

A legal change was made to HMM's proposal and tonight's resolution confirms the award.

2. Ash Lagoon Closure

The 3rd resolution on tonight's agenda awards HMM \$15,000 to assist the Authority with the Ash Lagoon Closure.

3. Sale of Surplus Property

Somerset Raritan still incinerates and several of its staff visited TBSA regarding the potential purchase of our incineration equipment. The equipment is being auctioned on GovDeals.com.

4. Ash Removal/Reuse

Mr. Solla is still negotiating with Spectraserv on the rate.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mr. John Scheri, of HMM distributed copies of the monthly Engineers Report and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects.

NEW BUSINESS: FY 2014 Annual Consulting Engineers Report (HMM)

Mr. Scheri presented the CE Report to the Board. HMM conducted its annual inspection in June. The report reviews last year's report and updates the status of the Authority system based on compliance milestones and inspections by the DEP. Performance data is updated. The report indicates that flows were stable over the last year and takes note of the incineration shutdown. He noted that the Authority has met all effluent requirements. The report describes the various regulatory programs and the status of the Authority's compliance in regard to those programs. It also summarizes the inspection and the accomplishments of the Authority. It identifies some potential upcoming projects, including the two major projects the Authority is undertaking now. The report concludes with HMM's recommendations and the cost projections over a 5 year period. Mr. Scheri noted that the facilities are in good condition. They are well maintained, particularly the aging facilities, and the staff should be commended. It was recommended by Mr. Voorman that all questions be held until the next meeting after the Board has had an opportunity to review the report.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: FY 2014 Proposed Budget – Review

Mr. Bongiovanni first addressed the capital budget, noting that it includes a 6th year as required by the DCA. He commented that the Authority is in decent financial shape taking into consideration the capital improvement projects, the expiring debt service, the new debt service and the remaining projects over the next 5 year period. He noted that analysis of the R&R funds shows that the R&R funds budgeted to be collected should offset any of our needs. However, he

noted that things can change. He informed the members that the DCA Budget format for the next fiscal year has been expanded to include much more information.

Mr. Bongiovanni then noted the report on the table regarding the effects of changing the flow estimates, as discussed at the previous meeting. He noted that after discussions with Pequannock and Fairfield, "Alternative A/B" was added to reflect the towns' wishes. Also on the table is a revised Page 17 of the budget consistent with those changes. Recommendation was made for approval of the budget with the distribution of user charges according to Alternative A/B and the use of \$200,000 of surplus funds. Following tonight's meeting, the budget will be sent out to the DCA and to the Participants for review. Further review of the budget, as needed, is scheduled for the October Board Meeting and final adoption of the budget will be in November.
