Mr. DeGraw reported that the grit and screens building is operating and large volumes of screenings and grit are being removed.

Amendment No. 4 breaks down the engineering fees between Black & Veatch, Mott MacDonald and Engineered Solutions. The amendment includes costs already incurred as well as anticipated expenses for the remainder of the project. Chuck Cuyulis explained the work ESC has been doing on the project, including correcting some of the instrumentation work that had already been completed by one of the subcontractors. Mr. Scheri reported that Mott MacDonald's previous budget amendment covered costs through May 2018. As a result of the contractor's poor performance the project has been extended resulting in additional costs for MM's onsite engineering.
