FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of August (copy attached), along with the vouchers and the monthly financial reports for Hatch Mott MacDonald and Cleary Giacobbe Alfieri Jacobs. Mr. Voorman recommended the payment of bills as presented.

PURCHASING & PERSONNEL:

Mr. Phelan presented the Personnel Actions for the month of August.

PLANT OPERATIONS:

Mr. Schmidt referenced the Operating Report on the table and noted that the flows are down. Mr. Solla noted that the Southside pump station electric bills are finally up to date. He also explained that the Authority has been making adjustments to the amount of PAC being added and have determined that the optimal amount per day is 100 gallons.

PLANNING & EXPANSION:

Mr. Kerwin had nothing to report.

CONSTRUCTION:

Mr. Verdonik noted that the demolition of the oxygen building has started and there is a new Project Manager on the job. Mr. Solla introduced Mr. Tarallo from Black & Veatch. Mr. Solla addressed the change order on the table related to the asbestos removal prior to the demolition of the oxygen building. Progress on the project has not been progressing as hoped and steps have been taken to ensure that future deadlines are met, including the change in Project Manager. Mr. Ripkey and Mr. Tarallo explained the process of testing the concrete and the excavation of the site. It was noted that most major submittals from Worth & Co. have been accepted but many of the secondary submittals have been rejected. Mr. Solla discussed the deadline approaching for 15% project completion by September 1 in the specifications and the options available to the Authority.

Project 2 is progressing on schedule. There has been a redesign of platforms at Southside pump station and there is an issue regarding flood protection around the transformer which needs to be resolved with PSE&G. Mr. Solla and Mr. Bongiovanni discussed the meeting with OEM, NJEIT and DEP and the status of the Hazard Mitigation grant.

INSURANCE AND LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:

Mr. Jacobs updated the Board on pending legislation, including the introduction of a bill that would allow Authorities to process payments electronically.

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Mr. Campisi had nothing to report.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT:

Mr. Bongiovanni had no formal report.

ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Solla discussed the resolutions on the table for the Board's approval. He then advised the Board that there was an electrical cable failure from the main substation to the first stage substation. The insurance company has been notified and the Authority is waiting for a quote from Reuter Hanney which will be forwarded to Hatch Mott for review. He commented that the staff did a great job in dealing with this cable failure. Mr. Solla then discussed the final sampling of the dicar wells in November. He noted that the next course of action will be determined after the results of the sampling are available.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mr. Ripkey noted the monthly Engineer's Report and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects. Mr. Tarallo expressed his appreciation for the opportunity for Black &

Veatch to work with the Authority on Project 1 and is hopeful that the project will get back on track soon.
