#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

## 1. NJPDES Discharge Permit

Since the September 3, 2014 denial of a Petition for Certification by the State Supreme Court, there has been little activity on matters related to our pending discharge permit renewal. This denial upholds the DEP decision to enforce the year round application of the Phosphorus TMDL. (We had been seeking seasonal limits). To recap: The draft discharge permit was issued in June 2012 by DEP. We submitted comments in August 2012, objecting to a number of permit limits/conditions, phosphorus being the most significant issue.

Looking forward, we are still waiting for the DEP to finalize its proposed rulemaking for Tiered Uses, which will result in potential new limits for nitrates.

#### 2. Two Bridges Road Bridge Project

After a number of phone calls and emails expressing our questions and concerns to the engineering firm (Louis Berger Group, Inc.), we decided to direct a letter to the Passaic County Engineer to more formally address our issues. Bill Murphy sent this letter out on January 22<sup>nd</sup>. Our key concerns are maintaining access to the front road of our plant and the replacement of (and possible funding for) 300 foot sections of 2 parallel 20 inch force mains in Lincoln Blvd.

### 3. Central P.S. Flow Meters

Progress on the investigation and repair of the flow metering systems is continuing, and we are proceeding with additional corrective actions. On the table is a copy of the Engineered Solutions Corporation status report on this effort, dated February 5, 2015.

#### 4. Contingency Operation Plan for PRBRSA

Dan Kelly has provided his Business Systems Manual for the PRBRSA dated December 2014 for our consideration and review. I am scheduling an initial meeting with Dan Kelly for the end of this month.

At this time, Mr. Bongiovanni reminded the Board that the AEA conference is in March and any Board Members who wish to attend should let us know. He also referenced the memo on the table regarding his objectives for 2015 for the Board's consideration.
