#### **RESOLUTION #25-010: Interest Rate for Late Payment of Annual Charges**

WHEREAS, Section 9 of the December 20, 1985 Agreement, Amending and Supplementing the Service Contracts for the Participants of the Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority (hereinafter the "Authority"), requires that the Authority charge an interest rate of eight percent (8%) per annum for the first \$1,500.00 of any delinquent payment made by a Participant after the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) calendar day following the date which payment was due; and

**WHEREAS,** Section 9 of the December 20, 1985 Agreement, Amending and Supplementing the Service Contracts for the Authority, further requires that the Authority annually at its Reorganizational Meeting set an interest rate on the delinquency of any payment by a Participant after the 10<sup>th</sup> calendar day following the date upon which it is due, on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00; and

**WHEREAS,** said rate was previously set by the Authority at its Reorganization Meeting of February 8, 2023.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** Be It Resolved by the Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority that for the fiscal year 2025 the interest rate on any delinquent payments by the Participants received by the Authority after the 10<sup>th</sup> calendar day following the date upon which it is due shall be twelve percent (12%) per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.00 and be calculated in accordance with Section 9 of said Agreement from the original due date;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a copy of the Resolution is provided to each of the Participants in accordance with the requirements of Section 9 of the Agreement.
