The meeting went into Closed Session at 6:05 p.m. and was reconvened to the public at 6:50 p.m. John Napolitano participated by phone in the closed session.

#### **REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:**

#### FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman was absent.

#### **PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:**

There were no personnel actions for the month of July.

### **PLANT OPERATIONS:**

Mr. Schmidt noted the Operating Report on the table, reporting that the flows were down due to the drier weather. Mr. DeGraw reported that the old generator functioned properly during the power outage but he noted we ran just half of the plant's operation due to the generator and its performance during hot conditions. He also noted that the Authority was feeling the stress of having some functions shut down or operating at a reduced level due to the construction during the hot weather. Mr. Bongiovanni reported that the Authority has begun replacing the flow meters beginning with flow meter M15.

#### **PLANNING and EXPANSION:**

Mr. Notte had nothing to report.

#### **CONSTRUCTION:**

Mr. Verdonik noted the construction report and the Black & Veatch report are on the table.

#### **INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:**

Mr. Runfeldt has nothing to report.

#### **LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:**

Mr. Campisi had nothing to report. Mr. Jacobs reported that the legislation regarding Rice Notice requirements has been repealed by the Supreme Court. Rice Notices are once again only required when action taken will adversely affect an employee.

#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Mr. Bongiovanni had no formal report. Mr. Bongiovanni noted that the first union contract negotiation meeting is scheduled to take place on Tuesday, July 17<sup>th</sup>.

#### **ENGINEER'S REPORT:**

Mr. Scheri referred to the copies of the monthly Engineers Report on the table and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

#### Interceptor Sewer Inspection Report

Ryan Gourley of Mott MacDonald presented a summary of the Interceptor Sewer System Inspection, Condition Assessment, and Rehabilitation Planning Project which was completed last year. The purpose of the project was to assess the condition of the Authority's interceptor sewer system. The findings have been used to develop a rehabilitation plan. Mr. Gourley reported that RedZone Robotics conducted inspection of approximately 66,000 linear feet of interceptor sewer and Mott MacDonald inspected a total of 260 interceptor manholes to identify defects and conditions. He summarized the procedures used for each project task and the result of the inspections, database reports and findings. He presented recommendations for rehabilitation and maintenance as well as the estimated costs. He noted that the Authority's overall interceptor sewer is in good condition and it is apparent that the Authority has been proactive in maintaining the system.

#### Preliminary TBSA FY 2019 Budget

Mr. Bongiovanni noted the Preliminary 2019 Budget on the table. He reviewed the budget approval and adoption schedule. Mr. Bongiovanni then proceeded to review the highlights of the budget, noting that the Capital Budget is being developed and will be presented in August. The flow estimates are based on current budgeted flows. These flows may be adjusted as needed based on additional reevaluation of flow data and input from the Towns. He discussed some of the more significant changes in expenses, noting there is a 4% overall increase in operating costs, partially due to the projected increase in labor costs as a result of the headworks improvements. Mr. Bongiovanni pointed out that the Authority will need to comply with the new law capping the budget at 2%, noting that there are no regulations issued yet to guide in the implementation of the law. Until then the Authority will prepare the budget in the same manner it has in the past. The preliminary bottom line is a 2.6% increase in participant charges prior to any use of surplus. He noted that over the past 5 years the participant charge increases have been small.

Mr. Bongiovanni requested that the Board Members complete the questionnaire on the table to assist us in preparing the DCA budget.
