#### **REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:**

#### FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of July (copy attached) along with the monthly financial reports for Mott MacDonald and Cleary Giacobbe and the vouchers. He recommended payment of the vouchers as presented. Mr. Voorman also noted that the FY 2015 Audit Report and the Preliminary 2017 Budget would be discussed later in the meeting.

### **PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:**

Mr. Phelan presented the Personnel Actions for the month of July. On motion by Mr. Phelan, seconded by Mr. Verdonik, the Personnel Actions were approved by the following vote:

### **PLANT OPERATIONS:**

Mr. Schmidt referred to the Operating report on the table, reporting that flows were down due to lack of rain. He also noted that phosphorous levels had risen due to the reduction in the use of PAC.

### **PLANNING and EXPANSION:**

Mr. Kerwin deferred to Mr. Bongiovanni. Mr. Bongiovanni reported that he attended a meeting with Black & Veatch regarding the next phase of capital improvements. This phase includes looking at what needs to be done; particularly the middle of the plant. He noted that there are some unknowns, including the nitrate regulations from the State. The Authority must also determine what capacity the treatment plant has and when to implement that capacity under the current permit conditions. He noted that the Authority has two sets of permit limits for different flow conditions. We are awaiting a proposal from Black & Veatch as a result of the meeting.

### **CONSTRUCTION:**

Mr. Verdonik noted the construction report on the table. Project 1 is at 26%, still behind schedule. Mr. Scheri noted that the generators have been delivered today and substation gear will be delivered by the end of the month, boosting the completion percentage to 65%. Project 2 is at 59%.

### **INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:**

Mr. Runfeldt deferred to Mr. Jacobs who reported that a new bill was introduced in the Senate which would allow Authorities to charge lesser fees to low income residents.

### **LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:**

Mr. Campisi had no formal report.

#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Mr. Bongiovanni had no formal report.

### **ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Mr. Solla was absent.

### **ENGINEER'S REPORT:**

Mr. Scheri distributed copies of the monthly Engineers Report and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects.

### **NEW BUSINESS: Preliminary FY 2017 Budget**

Mr. Bongiovanni noted the Preliminary 2017 Budget on the table. He reviewed the budget approval and adoption schedule. He noted that the flow estimates are based on current budgeted flows. These flows may be adjusted as needed based on additional reevaluation of flow data and input from the Towns. He discussed the change in debt service, as well as some of the more significant changes in expenses and outside revenues. Mr. Bongiovanni presented options for increasing the reserve for capital improvements. He requested that the Board Members review the options and get back to him with their recommendations.

### **NEW BUSINESS: FY 2015 Audit Report:**

Mr. Cuva distributed and reviewed the Financial Highlights Spreadsheet. He noted that FY 2014 had to be restated to comply with GASB 68 which relates to the net pension obligation to the State of New Jersey and PERS employees. He also noted that operating revenues decreased primarily due to the elimination of septage and sludge revenues. Operating expenses increased primarily due to the removal and disposal of the ash in the ash lagoons. Non-operating expenses were impacted by the cost of issuance of the NJEIT loans as well as the interest and amortization of our debt. He explained the change in designated and undesignated funds due to the designation of construction funds and the pension related adjustment. He noted that the current local pension liability is currently 48% funded. Mr. Cuva also explained that for budgetary purposes, the pension related adjustment funds are still available as surplus.
