FINANCE:

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. NJEIT Refunding

By letter dated May 26, 2016 the NJEIT has informed us that their recent bond refunding, used in part to finance our UV Disinfection Facilities Project, has resulted in a debt_service savings of approximately \$65,450. This savings will occur from now through September 2030. More detailed information and a revised debt service schedule from NJEIT is expected.

2. TBSA Master Plan for Capital Improvements

On July 6th we will be meeting with B&V to begin discussions on further developing our Capital Improvements Plan to address what needs to be done under a third phase of plant improvements for the middle of the plant processing facilities. Consideration will be given to redetermination of existing plant capacity (now without significant recycle flows from the incinerator process), achieving full permitted plant capacity of 9.639 mgd, and process upgrades which may be needed for nitrate removal.
