The DAG, Jacobine Dru, has indicated that there will be a simultaneous drafting of a Stipulation of Settlement and an initial draft permit modification, both presented for our review. Once the Stipulation of Settlement is signed, a formal draft permit modification will be issued. The expected time frame for this process to be completed is 3 to 8 months.

On Feb. 21<sup>st</sup> we received an OPRA request from American Transparency for employee records for 2016 including employee name, position title, date of hire, base salary amount, bonus amount, overtime amount and gross annual wages.
