- 1. The Authority hereby authorizes the limited payment of health insurance at retirement for its employees who have met the required conditions and with the following limitations:
 - a. The employee must have been hired by the Authority prior to April 1, 2016.
- b. The employee must have a minimum of twenty-five (25) years of service at the Authority.
 - c. The retired employee must be at least fifty-seven (57) years old.
- d. The Authority's reimbursement to the employee shall not exceed seven hundred dollars (\$700) per month.
- e. The limited reimbursement of retirement benefits shall be limited to a period of ten (10) years for the eligible employee.
- 2. This resolution is in accordance with the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the Authority and the United Public Service Employees Union which represents the union employees of the Authority.
