FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman was absent. Mr. Phelan presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of May (copy attached) along with the vouchers and the monthly financial reports for Mott MacDonald and Cleary Giacobbe. He recommended payment of the vouchers as presented.

PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:

There were no Personnel Actions for the month of May. Mr. Bongiovanni noted that there are revisions to several Personnel Policies on the agenda for approval.

PLANT OPERATIONS:

Mr. Schmidt noted the Operating Report on the table, noting that flows were down. Mr. DeGraw reported that due to the recent rain the filter system is over capacity at this time but we are meeting permit.

PLANNING and EXPANSION:

Mr. Notte had nothing to report.

CONSTRUCTION:

Mr. Verdonik noted the Construction Reports on the table. Mr. DeGraw reported that the grit performance test was being administered this week, evaluating the operation of the new grit system. All equipment is up and operating and functioning well.

INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:

Mr. Runfeldt was absent.

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Mr. Campisi had nothing to report.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. DEP Notice of CAP Threshold Exceedance

By letter of March 8, 2019 the DEP sent a Capacity Assurance Program (CAP) threshold exceedance notice to TBSA and a number of other NJPDES permittees. Diane Alexander responded by letter dated April 11, 2019 providing two separate arguments contesting the DEP finding of a CAP Exceedance. First, TBSA has a somewhat unique permit which allows for two flow stages, the higher of which is 9.639 MGD and is the flow that should be used to calculate any exceedance. Second, like many other permittees, unusually high flows were experienced in 2018 since it has been noted that 2018 is the wettest calendar year on record. As of now, we are waiting for the DEP to respond to our letter.

2. DEP UST Notice of Violation (NOV)

This NOV was received on March 29, 2019 and responded to by our letter on that same date with a subsequent follow up letter of April 1, 2019 providing a completed UST questionnaire as requested by DEP. The March 29th TBSA response clarified that we did comply with their requirement to have a licensed Class A and B operator as of the September 14, 2018 deadline. While we have not yet received a DEP response to this letter, we did receive a UST Systems Registration Certificate on April 12th.

Remedial Actions Permits (RAP) for Soil and Groundwater

By separate emails dated May 6, 2019 we received an RAP for Soil and another RAP for Groundwater from the DEP. Both these permits are effective April 30, 2019. We are planning to meet with Daniel Toder of Mott MacDonald to review the requirements and restrictions of these new permits. While remediation activities have been completed, there will be on going requirements for sampling, monitoring and reporting.

4. Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB)

On April 10, 2019 Milliman submitted their OPEB Valuation Report in accordance with GASB 74/75. This report information is updated every 2 years and has been submitted to our Auditor for incorporation into the FY 2018 Audit Report.

Mr. Scheri referred to the copies of the monthly Engineers Report on the table and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects. Mr. Bongiovanni provided additional details regarding the Project 1 Site Restoration work.
