### **REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:**

### FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of September (copy attached) along with the vouchers and the monthly financial reports for Mott MacDonald and Cleary Giacobbe. Mr. Voorman noted a payment to the State of NJ which is a reimbursement for an overpayment for Superstorm Sandy relief. He recommended payment of the Operating Vouchers as presented and payment of the Construction Vouchers pending discussion in Closed Session.

### **PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:**

There were no personnel actions for the month of September.

### **PLANT OPERATIONS:**

Mr. Schmidt referred to the Operating Report on the table, noting that flows are down due to the wet weather. Mr. DeGraw reported that he received a call from the DEP informing him that the nitrate levels in the river have been rising. There is some concern because this is

not normal. 5-year data was requested from the Authority. He noted that the Authority's nitrate levels have not increased.

### **PLANNING and EXPANSION:**

Mr. Notte was absent. Mr. DeGraw reported that Black & Veatch has requested information from the Authority for the masterplan capacity evaluation.

### **CONSTRUCTION:**

Mr. Verdonik noted the construction report on the table. He reported that Project 1 is 80% complete and Project 2 is 95% complete. Mr. DeGraw reported that we are hoping to start up the three main pumps on Project 2 and that we are nearing the end of the project. Mr. Scheri noted that the current Contractor's Schedule on Project 1 indicates a completion date in April 2018.

### **INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:**

Mr. Jacobs discussed several approved bills and proposed regulation, including certification of federal hiring requirements and a proposed DCA regulation regarding accumulated sick time payouts.

### **LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:**

Mr. Campisi had nothing to report.

### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

### 1. NJPDES Discharge Permit – Request for Hearing

On the table is a confidential memo from Diane Alexander summarizing and updating the status of our Adjudicatory Hearing Request from May 15, 2015. Each of the five (5) contested items is presented along with a proposed resolution for each item. Accordingly, a draft Stipulation of Settlement has been proposed and a Resolution is on the agenda for your consideration, to authorize our execution of the Stipulation of Settlement.

### **ENGINEER'S REPORT:**

Mr. Scheri referred to the copies of the monthly Engineers Report on the table and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects. A discussion ensued regarding the DICAR wells remediation.

### UNFINISHED BUSINESS: FY 2018 Proposed Budget Review

Mr. Bongiovanni reported that the Budget (in both formats) will be sent out soon to the towns and DCA. He noted that there are no changes to what was previously presented. The towns will be requested to make any comments prior to next Board Meeting.

### **NEW BUSINESS:** 10-Year Summary of Costs and Revenues

Mr. Bongiovanni noted the reports on the table summarizing the costs and revenues over the past ten years based on the actual audit reports. He reminded the Board of the unusual activities during 2014 due to the incineration shutdown and the early redemption of the E1 and E2 bonds. Overall, expenses decreased approximately \$400,000 (6.3%) over the ten year period, primarily due to a decrease in energy costs. He noted, however, that once the plant upgrade is completed, our energy usage will increase. Debt Service will also increase in 2017 due to the added funding for the current projects. Participant payments have increased an average of 4.35% per year over the ten year period. However, the average increase for the last

six years is about 1.47% per year. Participant payments per MGD have increased but this is due to the more recent lower flow readings. Net position has increased over the past ten years.

All members received copies of the correspondence prior to the meeting. There was a short discussion regarding Rice notices. All correspondence is on file with the Authority Secretary.

WHEREAS, the Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority (hereinafter "the Authority" or "TBSA"") received a New Jersey Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit ("NJPDES Permit") relevant to its discharge of highly treated wastewater to the Pompton River, which NJPDES permit contained conditions and requirements that are arbitrary, capricious, unreasonable and without technical basis; and

WHEREAS, the Authority commenced litigation against the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP") entitled Two Bridges Sewerage Authority v. New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, OAL Docket Number ELU 18389-2016 N, Agency Reference No.: NJ0029386-46775, to contest certain provisions of TBSA's NJPDES Permit. The provisions at issue appertain to: 1) the requirement to monitor for 209 PCB congeners 2) the frequency of E. Coli sampling and the related requirement to split sample for E. Coli and fecal coliform, 3) the loading and concentration limitations for Carbonaceous Biological Oxygen Demand ("CBOD5") during winter under the increased flow value of 9.639 million gallons per day (MGD) 4) the loading and concentration limitations for ammonia during the winter under the increased flow value of 9.639 MGD 5) the loading and concentration limitations for Total Oxygen Demand (TOD) during the summer under the increased flow value of 9.639 MGD; and

WHEREAS, the NJDEP and the Authority have engaged in settlement negotiations and NJDEP issued a proposed form of settlement document, attached hereto, resolving the contested issues; and

**WHEREAS**, the terms of the proposed settlement document meet the objectives of the Authority in commencing this litigation, and therefore a withdrawal of the above referenced litigation, is appropriate upon the adoption of a permit containing the terms of settlement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority as follows:
