FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of September (copy attached) along with the vouchers and the monthly financial reports for Mott MacDonald and Cleary Giacobbe. Mr. Voorman recommended payment of the vouchers as presented.

PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:

Mr. Phelan presented the Personnel Actions for the month of September. On motion by Mr. Phelan, seconded by Mr. Schmidt, the Personnel Actions were approved by the following vote:

PLANT OPERATIONS:

Mr. Schmidt referred to the Operating Report on the table. Mr. Thomas Bongiovanni reported on the status of the meter at M15, advising that the meter has been stabilized and flows will be adjusted as necessary. Mr. DeGraw reported that the Deepavaal Pump Station became inundated with water during a severe rain storm on August 11th but the Project 2 upgrades saved the station from going under. The Authority also had to activate the force mains to the new headworks building which performed well. He noted the staff responded immediately to the situation and was on site 24/7.

PLANNING and EXPANSION:

Mr. Notte was absent.

CONSTRUCTION:

Mr. Verdonik noted the construction report on the table.

INSURANCE & LEGISLATIVE REVIEW:

Mr. Runfeldt had nothing to report. Mr. Jacobs reminded the Board that the legislation that passed in May requiring all New Jersey employers to provide paid sick leave goes into effect October 29th. He noted that while the Authority's current policy provides adequate sick time, the law also expands what is considered a sick day. The regulations have not yet been issued.

LEGAL & PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Mr. Campisi had nothing to report.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

1. Passaic River Basin Alliance (PRBA)

A meeting of the membership of the PRBA was held on June 26, 2018 at TBSA. Several actions were taken at the meeting, including:

- a. Election of Trustees (including Bob as President)
- b. Vote of 12 to 2 against dissolving the PRBA
- c. Request proposal from Kleinfelder to run the Passaic River model.

One other fact to note is that the PRBA still has close to \$100,000 in funds previously provided by its members.

2. AEA Events

The AEA fall conference is scheduled for November 13 and 14, 2018 at Bally's in Atlantic City. Also, the AEA has scheduled Commissioners Suppers for Wednesday, October 10th at the Hanover Sewerage Authority and Thursday, October 18th at the Atlantic County Utilities Authority.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mr. Scheri referred to the copies of the monthly Engineers Report on the table and brought the members up-to-date on all on-going projects.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: FY 2019 Proposed Budget Review

Mr. Bongiovanni reported that the Budget (in both formats) will be sent out soon to the towns and DCA. He noted that the only change from what was previously presented was an adjustment to PRBRSA's flow as requested. This will impact the allocation of operating costs among the Participants. The towns will be requested to make any comments prior to next Board Meeting. He also reported that the DCA will be issuing a Local Finance Notice regarding the 2% cap.

NEW BUSINESS: 10-Year Summary of Costs and Revenues

Karen Napolitano noted the reports on the table summarizing the costs and revenues over the past ten years based on the audit reports. She reminded the Board of the unusual activities during 2014 due to the incineration shutdown and the early redemption of the E1 and E2 bonds. Operation and Administration expenses decreased approximately \$800,000 (11.6%) over the ten year period, primarily due to a decrease in energy costs. She noted, however, that once the plant upgrade is completed, our energy usage will increase. Debt Service is down despite additional funding for four new projects during the 10-year period. This is due to the expiration of the Series E Bonds and the PRBRSA debt. Participant payments have increased an average of 3.5% per year over the ten year period. However, the average increase for the last seven years is about 1.4% per year. Participant payments per MGD have increased but this

is partly due to the more recent lower flow readings. Net position has increased over the past ten years.

CORRESPONDENCE:

All members received copies of the correspondence prior to the meeting. All correspondence is on file with the Authority Secretary. Mr. Bongiovanni discussed correspondence received from the DEP indicating that we are in compliance. He noted that we receive these letters several times a year and they are rarely acknowledged. He commended the staff and Ernie for a job well done. A discussion also ensued regarding the risk control survey recommendations.

PUBLIC DISCUSSION:

There was no public present.

Set Subdivision Review and Sewer Extension Permit Fees

- 4. If a subdivision review or sewer extension permit does not reasonable relate to the above definitions, then the review fees shall be set by the Authority.
